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Is Oxycodone Addictive?

Oxycodone is synthetically modified from opioid molecules obtained from poppy. Although oxycodone is fabricated in a lab, it carries similar traits and imparts in a similar way to the other opioids. It shares agonist properties and has a significant effect on the central nervous system, a phenomenon that is associated with the use of morphine and heroin. Also, like any other opioid in the market, oxycodone can deliver a powerful feeling of "highness," also known as euphoria, thus rendering the drug potential for substance abuse.

Prolonged use of oxycodone has been associated with the development of tolerance and dependence. And even though heavy opioid users develop a considerable amount of tolerance to the illegal drugs, they do not develop a tolerance towards the lethal side effects of the drugs. Most of them are frequently hospitalized or even die due to the effects of the drugs.

Many individuals who are addicted to Oxycodone began their addiction journey through a legal prescription, only for them to unwittingly become dependent on the drug. Owing to desperation, tolerance levels, and limited access to the oxycodone, most of the addicts turn to stronger opioids such as heroin.
